Announcements by CWSS to WSB43

1. The SIMP available in four languages

The SIMP Integrated Management Plan for ONE Wadden Sea World Heritage has been translated and proofread into Danish, German and Dutch. The English version of the SIMP shall prevail in the event of any discrepancies with the translated versions.

2. Korean Getbol International Symposium

The "International Symposium of Getbol World Heritage 2024: Directions for the Future" was held from 17 to 19 April on the occasion of the 3rd Anniversary of the Korean Getbol World Heritage inscription. CWSS was invited to deliver a congratulatory message and to present the achievements and challenges of the Wadden Sea World Heritage and the Trilateral Monitoring and Assessment Programme. WWF was invited to present the Wadden Sea initiatives on sustainable tourism and education, focusing on the International Wadden Sea School.

The symposium was followed by a study visit under the MoU, which was renewed in May 2023. The study visit included meetings with officials and representatives of the World Heritage components and the new areas that will be proposed to UNESCO in a Phase 2 to achieve the integrity of the site.

3. Climate resilient East Atlantic Flyway' project proposal

The 'Climate resilient East Atlantic Flyway' project proposal has been submitted to the International Climate Initiative on 15 December 2023. The project now includes 15 partners from 11 flyway countries and focuses on making advanced progress in knowledge gain, wetland management, updates of relevant policies, livelihood improvements and education/communication. The first round of reviewer comments has been addressed by CWSS. If the project is funded, implementation of activities is expected to start beginning of 2025 at the latest.

4. Quality Status Report Climate Change

The Wadden Sea Quality Status Report (QSR) thematic report on climate change by Philippart et al., 2024 has been published and is available online https://qsr.waddensea-worldheritage.org/reports/climate-change

5. Trilateral Swimway Conference

From 17-19 April 2024, the second Trilateral Swimway Conference was held in Groningen, Netherlands. With 150 participants, the conference was fully booked. Dedicated to understanding and preserving diverse fish life cycles in the world's largest tidal flats system, the symposium featured the latest research advancements alongside discussions on practical measures to uphold and restore the viability of fish populations within the Wadden Sea. The 3-day event was set within the Waddenacademie Symposium series, and back to back with the Free Flow 2024 conference, which allowed exchange between the communities. The 2024 Swimway Conference was organised by the Trilateral Expert Group Swimway, CWSS, Waddenacademie, Waddenvereniging, the University of Groningen, Wageningen Marine Research, van Hall Larenstein University, Danish National Park Wadden Sea, and Danish Ministry of Environment in the framework of the Trilateral Wadden Sea Cooperation. The next Swimway conference is expected to be organised in Denmark in three years' time.

6. CO2 sequestration workshop


An online workshop on CO2 Sequestration in the Wadden Sea -State of knowledge and open questions is planned for 13 June 2024, 10am - 1pm. Exchange of information among experts, representing science, nature conservation or management, is key to better understand the current state of knowledge on CO2 sequestration in the Wadden Sea and assess the area's potential in contributing to the reduction of greenhouse gases. This webinar shall be a first step to gain an overview on available information, while also providing opportunities for experts to discuss e.g., knowledge gaps, opportunities for a trilateral assessment of CO2 sequestration and/or potential impact of management actions on CO2 sequestration in the Wadden Sea.
